Our first book is *The Mountains Wild* by Sarah Stewart Taylor

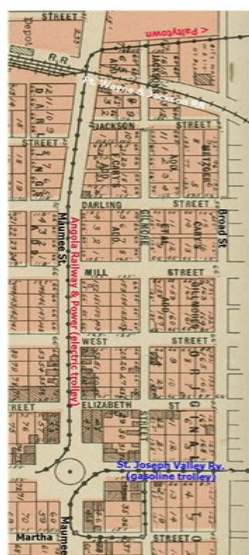
VITA Tax Preparation Assistance—Wednesdays, beginning February 2nd.

Changes To Our Overdrive Collection

Several of the smaller Overdrive consortiums in Indiana are joining together to create one large one. This will allow us to have more resources going into the collection. The Indiana State Library will be contributing to our budget, which means that all of our local money will go to books and audio books. In addition to the increase in the collection there will be a committee monitoring high demand items in order to reduce wait times.

The new Indiana Digital Library will go live on February 1st. Patrons will need to log in with their library card, but checkouts, holds, and wishlists will carry over so the transition should be seamless.
